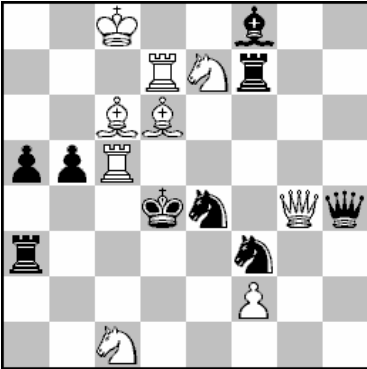
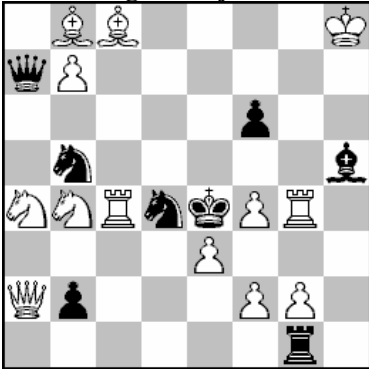
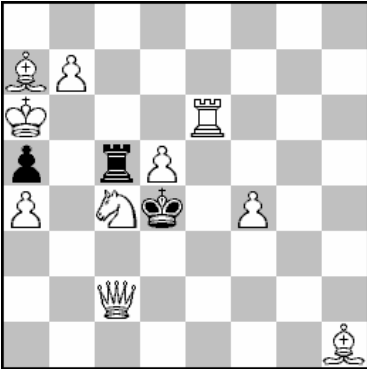


# Belgrade Internet TT 2006
